Ministry Call:

2. Regularly attend weekly and/or quarterly fellowship events.
3. Be present at any team meetings needed to plan fellowship events.
4. Regularly contact and/or visit those students you connect with.
5. Be a Christian example in conduct and speech and committed to nurturing your own life of faith.
6. Be prepared for all assigned tasks to which you agree.
7. Let other team members know when you cannot attend any weekly/quarterly events.
8. Seek and pray for spiritual fullness in Christ for yourself, members of your team, and for the youth of Christ UMC.

In return, the High School Youth Director and fellow volunteers agree to:

1. Guide and support you in nurturing your own spiritual fullness in Christ through this ministry call.
2. Keep you well informed of all Youth Ministry plans and programs.
3. Provide you with any training and resources you might need to carry out your team's ministry.
4. Pray for you.
5. Provide child-care for your children during planning meetings and your team's programs.
6. Pay any expenses incurred as a result of youth ministry programs.
7. Listen to your needs and concerns about your ministry.
